

PROJECT PROPOSAL

Building a motorcycle shed for the Marris Hall, University of Peradeniya

August 2015

Background

Marrs Hall, one of the oldest residential halls in University of Peradeniya houses nearly 240 male undergraduates. The vast majority of residents in the hall over the past decade have been medical and dental students. Most of the students possess motorcycles as they need to attend clinical sessions at the nearby teaching hospitals.

The hall possesses a line of garages, currently dilapidated, leaving the students with no area for parking their motorcycles. The motorcycles are, therefore, parked everywhere- at the entrances, round the cafeteria, and on the hallways, creating a totally messy environment in the Hall. Despite repeated requests made to the university to erect a shed for the motorcycles the status quo has remained unchanged, over the years. It is proposed that a cycle shed be erected for the use of students.

The estimated cost for building a motorcycle shed to accommodate one hundred motorcycles prepared with the assistance of NCI Homes, Kandy is 1,157,250.00 (Contract and retention fee)
